## HOME & COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES SUPERVISOR

## No 62-373 Examination Open to the Public

The examination will be held to establish an eligible list used to fill one (1) current vacancy and any other vacancies that may occur in the Niagara County Mental Health Department during the life of the list. The list established from this exam will supersede any existing list for this title.

<u>RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS:</u> Candidates must have been legal residents of Niagara County for at least one (1) month immediately preceding the date of the written examination and such residency must continue until the time of appointment. Preference in appointment may be given to successful candidates who have been residents of the municipality in which the appointment is made. Non-residents may be required to become a resident of the appointing municipality if local law so states.

<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Candidates must meet the following on or before the date of the written exam. If you do not meet these qualifications, your application will be disapproved and your filing fee will not be refunded.

Candidates must be a current Licensed Master Social Worker (LMSW) or Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) in New York State (LCSW preferred) and have two (2) years of full-time paid experience providing social work services in a community based setting including experience with crisis intervention and case management/referral and linkage.

**DUTIES:** This is a professional and administrative title involving clinical supervision and management for community mental hygiene services related to community based mental health programs in hospital and placement diversion, Home and Community Based Services (HCBS), peer run services, family treatment services, and forensic care by providing direct services and managing the services of community based programs serving this population. These programs cover the entire life span from children to the geriatric population and work in coordination with other community mental health programs. The incumbent will provide and/or oversee the provision of HCBS services in a variety of settings. Except for services provided in inpatient settings, the majority of the contacts with recipients will be offsite in the community for the purpose of engaging clients into care and facilitating their use of skills in the community. The incumbent is responsible for ensuring that all programs and individual service providers in this area maintain client records at professional standards, report data that measures outcomes, assesses the data, and reports to the Department of Mental Health A dmin is tration with recommendations for expansion or changes in this treatment community. All duties are performed in accordance and c omp liance with local, state, and federal regulatory requirements. Work is performed under the general supervision of the Director or Deputy Director, as assigned. General supervision is exercised and assigned over subordinates in these community based services. Does related work as required.

NOTICE TO CANDIDATES: The use of calculators is ALLOWED. Unless otherwise notified, candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand-held, solar or battery powered calculators. Devices with typewriter keyboard such as computers, spell checkers, person al digital assistants, address books, language translators, dictionaries or any similar devices are prohibited. Cell phones and smart watches are prohibited.

**DRUG SCREENING:** Applicants may be required to undergo a drug-screening test to determine suitability for appointment in accordance with local policies. Applicants who test positive may be restricted from future certification.

**BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION:** Applicants may be required to undergo a State and national criminal history background investigation, which will include a fingerprint check to determine suitability for appointment. Failure to meet the standards for the background investigation may result in disqualification.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY OR POSTMARKED BY THE FILING DEADLINE. YOUR APPLICATION WILL BE DISAPPROVED IF PAYMENT IS NOT RECEIVED BY THE FILING DEADLINE.

**<u>FEE WAIVERS</u>**: Waivers for the filing fee must be completed in full and submitted with required documentation or your application will be disapproved.

**SUBJECT OF EXAMINATION:** There will be a written test which you must pass in order to be considered for appointment. The written test will be designed to test for knowledge, skills, and/or abilities in such areas as:

- 1. Ensuring effective inter/intra agency communications: These questions test for understanding of techniques for interacting effectively with individuals and agencies, to educate and inform them about topics of concern, to clarify agency programs or policies, to negotiate conflicts or resolve complaints, and to represent one's agency or program in a manner in keeping with good public relations practices. Questions may also cover interacting with the staff of one's own agency and/or that of other agencies in cooperative efforts of public outreach or service.
- **Preparing written material:** These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.
- 3. <u>Understanding and interpreting written material</u>: These questions test for the ability to understand and interpret written material. You will be presented with brief reading passages and will be asked questions about the passages. You should base your answers to the questions **only** on what is presented in the passages and **not** on what you may happen to know about the topic.
- **Supervision:** These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in planning, organizing, and controlling the activities of a work unit toward predetermined objectives. The concepts covered, usually in a situational question format, include such topics as assigning and reviewing work; evaluating performance; maintaining work standards; motivating and developing subordinates; implementing procedural change; increasing efficiency; and dealing with problems of absenteeism, morale, and discipline.
- **Organizing and Administering Social Work Services Programs:** These questions test for the knowledge and ability to develop, oversee and administer social work services programs. Questions may cover such topics as developing and administering policies and procedures, planning, implementing, monitoring and evaluating program services and staff, interpreting and applying social services laws, regulations and standards, and representing agency programs to community agencies, individuals and groups.

The New York State Department of Civil Service has not prepared a test guide for this examination. However, candidates may find information in the publication "How to take a written test" helpful in preparing for this test. <u>CANDIDATES NOTE</u>: You are responsible for completing all sections of the official application. To receive credit for experience on a job, basic information such as address, name and title of supervisor, hours in the work week, final salary, and duties performed by you, must be shown. Be very specific in explaining experience that will qualify you for the position sought. Ambiguity and vagueness will not be resolved in your favor. **EACH SEPARATE SHEET ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION MUST BE SIGNED.** 

<u>MULTIPLE EXAMINATIONS SCHEDULED FOR THE SAME DAY</u>: If you have applied to take a written test announced by either one or several local jurisdictions (county, town, city) scheduled to be held on the same test date as this written test, you must notify each of the local jurisdictions no later than two weeks before the test date, so they can make arrangement for taking all tests at one test site. All examination for positions in State government will be held at a State Examination Center.

COLLEGE ACCREDITATION: Your degree must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized as an accrediting agency by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If your degree was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide in dependent verification of equivalency. You must pay the required evaluation fee.

COLLEGE CREDITS MUST BE VERIFIED WITH AN OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT. If you have listed college or special courses on your application it will be necessary for you to submit an official transcript or special course certificate. Documents can be submitted electronically or in hardcopy format but must be on official letterhead or stationary. If these documents are not on file prior to canvassing/certification for vacant positions, your name will not be canvassed/certified and your name will be removed from consideration for all appointments.

This examination will be prepared and rated in accordance with Section 23(2) of the Civil Service Law. The provisions of the New York State Civil Service Law, Rules and Regulations dealing with preparation and rating of examinations, as well as establishment and certification of eligible lists for positions in the classified service will apply to this examination.
