POLICE SERGEANT (VILLAGE OF MIDDLEPORT)

No 71-335 Promotional Examination

Salary Range: \$23.00 - \$25.00

The examination will be held to establish an eligible list used to fill any vacancies in the Village of Middleport Police Department that may occur during the life of the list.

<u>PROMOTIONAL QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Two (2) years of full-time permanent competitive class status as a Police Officer in the Village of Middleport immediately preceding the date of examination.

SPECIAL NOTE: After 09/01/84, no person shall be eligible for appointment nor shall be appointed to any rank above the rank of police officer unless he or she has been *appointed a police officer from an eligible list established according to merit and fitness as provided by Section Six of Article Five of the Constitution of the State of New York, or has previously served as a member of the New York State Police. Chapter 1016 of the laws of 1983, Section 58 1-b, New York State Civil Service Law, MSD-CL-23-83. (Added 06/13/85)

<u>SENIORITY CREDIT</u>: Seniority is based on the length of continuous permanent classified service in the jurisdiction in which promotion is sought, with points added to an eligible candidate's passing score for each appropriate five-year period or fraction thereof in accordance with the following schedule:

Less than 1 year	0 points
1 year up to 6 years	1 point
Over 6 years up to 11 years	2 points
Over 11 years up to 16 years	3 points
Over 16 years up to 21 years	4 points
Over 21 years up to 26 years	5 points

<u>NOTE</u>: Any person otherwise meeting the requirements for an examination, who was laid off from an agency for which the exam is being held, and whose name is presently on a **PREFERRED LIST**, is eligible to compete in the exam. When completing their application, such persons should be sure to indicate their present employment and/or title and location of their last permanent employment in the municipality.

<u>DUTIES</u>: Has immediate charge of the activities of police officers on an assigned shift. An employee in this class is responsible for the police work of subordinates or for specialized duties, which he personally performs. Supervision is exercised over the police officers through inspections and the assignment of duties in accordance with general instructions received from a superior officer. Does related work as required.

<u>FEE WAIVERS</u>: Waivers for the filing fee must be completed in full and submitted with required supporting documentation or your application will be disapproved.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY OR POSTMARKED BY THE FILING DEADLINE. YOUR APPLICATION WILL BE DISAPPROVED IF PAYMENT IS NOT RECEIVED BY THE FILING DEADLINE.

<u>NOTICE TO CANDIDATES</u>: The use of calculators is **PROHIBITED**. Unless otherwise notified, candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand-held, solar or battery powered calculators. Devices with typewriter keyboard such as computers, spell checkers, personal digital assistants, address books, language translators, dictionaries or any similar devices are prohibited. **Cell phones and smart watches are prohibited**.

SUBJECT OF EXAMINATION: There will be a written test which you must pass in order to be considered for appointment. The written test will be designed to test for knowledge, skills, and/or abilities in such areas as:

- 1. <u>Law enforcement methods and practices</u>: These questions test for knowledge of accepted police methods and practices and/or their application to situations in the police field. The questions are a sampling of the various knowledge that police personnel may be required to possess in the course of their day-to-day work-related activities.
- 2. <u>Supervision</u>: These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in planning, organizing, and controlling the activities of a work unit toward predetermined objectives. The concepts covered, usually in a situational question format, include such topics as assigning and reviewing work; evaluating performance; maintaining work standards; motivating and developing subordinates; implementing procedural change; increasing efficiency; and dealing with problems of absenteeism, morale, and discipline.
- 3. <u>Understanding and interpreting written material</u>: These questions test how well you comprehend written material. You will be provided with brief reading selections and will be asked questions about the selections. All the information required to answer the questions will be presented in the selections; you will not be required to have any special knowledge relating to the subject areas of the selections.
- 4. <u>Preparing written material in a police setting</u>: These questions test for the ability to prepare the types of reports that police personnel write. Some questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately. They consist of restatements of information given in note form. You must choose the best version from each set of four choices. Other questions test for the ability to organize paragraphs. They consist of paragraphs with their sentences out of order. For each of the paragraphs you must choose, from four suggestions, the best order of the sentences.
- 5. <u>New York State Laws Police</u>: These questions test for knowledge of the laws in effect on January 1, 2024 that law enforcement personnel may encounter in the course of their day-to-day work-related activities. The questions are a sampling of job-related sections of the Penal Law, Criminal Procedure Law, Vehicle and Traffic Law, Family Court Act and other laws relevant to law enforcement in New York State.

Candidates not having access to a computer or the internet may request copy of the test guide from the municipal civil service office conducting this examination using the contact information found elsewhere on this announcement.

<u>CANDIDATES NOTE</u>: You are responsible for completing all sections of the official application. To receive credit for experience on a job, basic information such as address, name and title of supervisor, hours in the work week, final salary, and duties performed by you, must be shown. Be very specific in explaining experience that will qualify you for the position sought. Ambiguity and vagueness will not be resolved in your favor. EACH SEPARATE SHEET ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION MUST BE SIGNED.

MULTIPLE EXAMINATIONS SCHEDULED FOR THE SAME DAY: If you have applied to take a written test announced by either one or several local jurisdictions (county, town, city) scheduled to be held on the same test date as this written test, you must notify each of the local jurisdictions no later than two weeks before the test date, so they can make arrangement for taking all tests at one test site. All examinations for positions in State government will be held at a State Examination Center.

This examination will be prepared and rated in accordance with Section 23(2) of the Civil Service Law. The provisions of the New York State Civil Service Law, Rules and Regulations dealing with preparation and rating of examinations, as well as establishment and certification of eligible lists for positions in the classified service will apply to this examination.
