Under direct supervision, an employee in this class performs duties involving both initial and continuing direct, personal contact with victims and/or witnesses; trainings and development through individual and group conferences; and maintaining regular case files and statistical reports. The incumbent provides victims and/or witnesses with necessary information on court procedures, accompanies them throughout the entire court process, and provides referrals to appropriate community services as necessary. The incumbent establishes a successful working relationship with the victims and witnesses, police agencies, District Attorney's Office, court system, and service providers. Direct supervision is received from the Victim Services Coordinator. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: <u>Candidates must meet one of the following:</u>

1. Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with a Bachelor's Degree in

<u>Criminal Justice, Human Services, Psychology, Sociology or any behavioral science</u> <u>related to community services; OR</u>

- 2. Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with an Associate's Degree in Criminal Justice, Human Services, Psychology, Sociology or any behavioral science related to community services and two (2) years of experience in the delivery of health, social or community services; OR
- 3. Graduation from high school or possession of an equivalency diploma and four (4) years experience in the delivery of health, social or community services.

NOTE: Part-time or verifiable volunteer experience will be pro-rated toward meeting experience requirements.
