Salary Range: \$29.00 - \$39.75

The examination will be held to establish an eligible list used to fill two (2) new vacancies and any other appropriate vacancies at SUNY Niagara that may occur during the life of the list.

<u>PROMOTIONAL QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Two (2) years of permanent competitive status as a Campus Peace Officer at SUNY Niagara immediately preceding the examination.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:

- 1. Candidates must possess a valid New York State Vehicle operator's license at time of appointment.
- 2. Candidates must be registered with the New York State Department of DCJS State as a Campus Peace Officer at time of appointment.
- 3. Employees must complete a required course for first line supervisory Police Officers as required by Section 209-a of the General Municipal Law within one (1) year of appointment.

SENIORITY CREDIT: Seniority is based on the length of continuous permanent classified service in the jurisdiction in which promotion is sought, with points added to an eligible candidate's passing score for each appropriate five-year period or fraction thereof in accordance with the following schedule:

Less than 1 year	0 points
1 year up to 6 years	1 point
Over 6 years up to 11 years	2 points
Over 11 years up to 16 years	3 points
Over 16 years up to 21 years	4 points
Over 21 years up to 26 years	5 points

<u>NOTE</u>: Any person otherwise meeting the requirements for an examination, who was laid off from an agency for which the exam is being held, and whose name is presently on a **PREFERRED LIST**, is eligible to compete in the exam. When completing their application, such persons should be sure to indicate their present employment and/or title and location of their last permanent employment in the municipality.

DUTIES: This is an important first-line supervisory position in the Office of Campus Public Safety in which incumbents are responsible for maintaining the security and safety of students, campus personnel, and college property; for enforcing campus regulations and New York State Laws; and for obtaining the appropriate assistance when medical emergencies or criminal incidents occur. The incumbent performs Campus Police/Peace Officer functions and is responsible for direct supervision of Campus Police/Peace Officers and Security Officers. The incumbent exercises independent judgment and is allowed wide latitude in carrying out the details of the work in accordance with procedures, policies, regulations, and laws. General supervision is received from the Chief of Campus Public Safety. The incumbent will performall related duties as required.

<u>NOTICE TO CANDIDATES</u>: The use of calculators is **ALLOWED**. Unless otherwise notified, candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand-held, solar or battery powered calculators. Devices with typewriter keyboard such as computers, spell checkers, person al digital assistants, address books, language translators, dictionaries or any similar devices are prohibited. **Cell phones and smart watches are prohibited**.

FEE WAIVERS: Waivers for the filing fee must be completed in full and submitted with required supporting documentation or your application will be disapproved.

SUBJECT OF EXAMINATION: There will be a written test which you must pass in order to be considered for appointment. The written test will be designed to test for knowledge, skills, and/or abilities in such areas as:

- 1. <u>Preparing written material</u>: These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.
- 2. <u>Understanding and interpreting written material</u>: These questions test for the ability to understand and interpret written material. You will be presented with brief reading passages and will be asked questions about the passages. You should base your answers to the questions **only** on what is presented in the passages and **not** on what you may happen to know about the topic.
- 3. <u>Principles and practices of safety and security</u>: These questions test for a knowledge of the proper principles and practices in the field of safety and security. The questions will cover such areas as selecting the best course of action to take in a safety or security related situation.
- 4. <u>Following directions (maps)</u>: These questions test your ability to follow physical/geographic directions using street maps or building maps. You will have to read and understand a set of directions and then use them on a simple map.
- 5. <u>Supervision</u>: These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in planning, organizing, and controlling the activities of a work unit toward predetermined objectives. The concepts covered, usually in a situational question format, include such topics as assigning and reviewing work; evaluating performance; maintaining work standards; motivating and developing subordinates; implementing procedural change; increasing efficiency; and dealing with problems of absenteeism, morale, and discipline.

Candidates not having access to a computer or the internet may request copy of the test guide from the municipal civil service office conducting this examination using the contact information found elsewhere on this announcement.

<u>CANDIDATES NOTE</u>: You are responsible for completing all sections of the official application. To receive credit for experience on a job, basic information such as address, name and title of supervisor, hours in the work week, final salary, and duties performed by you, must be shown. Be very specific in explaining experience that will qualify you for the position sought. Ambiguity and vagueness will not be resolved in your favor. EACH SEPARATE SHEET ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION MUST BE SIGNED.

<u>MULTIPLE EXAMINATIONS SCHEDULED FOR THE SAME DAY</u>: If you have applied to take a written test announced by either one or several local jurisdictions (county, town, city) scheduled to be held on the same test date as this written test, you must notify each of the local jurisdictions no later than two weeks before the test date, so they can make arrangement for taking all tests at one test site. All examinations for positions in State government will be held at a State Examination Center.

This examination will be prepared and rated in accordance with Section 23(2) of the Civil Service Law. The provisions of the New York State Civil Service Law, Rules and Regulations dealing with preparation and rating of examinations, as well as establishment and certification of eligible lists for positions in the classified service will apply to this examination.
