The work involves furnishing advice and guidance to local officials and the general public in regard to environmental health and environmental conservation problems, and the measures necessary for improvements and compliance with legal requirements. The incumbent supervises the enforcement of the provisions of the Public Health Laws and Sanitary Codes and Environmental Conservation Rules and Regulations in relation to environmental health matters. The incumbent is responsible for and has immediate charge of one or more specialized areas of environmental health. Supervision may be exercised over Assistant Public Health Engineers and Public Health Sanitarians. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: PROMOTIONAL:

Two (2) years of permanent competitive class status as an Assistant Public Health Engineer in the Niagara County Health Department immediately preceding the date of written examination.

OPEN COMPETITIVE:

Two (2) years of satisfactory full-time paid experience as an Assistant Public Health Engineer or Public Health Engineer. The term public health engineer shall mean a person who applies engineering principles for the detection, evaluation, control and management of those factors in the environment which influence the public's health.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:

- Individuals meeting the above requirements may apply for a certificate as a Supervising Public Health Engineer issued by the Niagara County Public Health Director. Possession of the certificate is required at the time of appointment.
- 2. The applicant must have a professional engineering license issued by the State of New York at time of appointment and throughout duration of employment.
- 3. Possession of a New York State Driver's license at time of appointment and throughout duration of employment.

<u>NOTE</u>: Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New York State Board of Regents to grant degrees with a Doctorate or Master's Degree in engineering acceptable to the Niagara County Public Health Director may be substituted for one (1) year of the general experience requirement.
